

TEACH THE TEACHER IGNITE: VIRTUAL PROGRAM

Students lead collaborative conversations with their school staff about how students and teachers can work together to address a school issue chosen by students.

VicSRC supports your students to choose an issue, and plan and deliver a short professional development (PD) session for school staff. This can be the whole school staff or a targeted group (e.g. teachers of a certain year level, learning area leaders or pastoral care staff). Students are then supported to create an action plan from the discussions at this session.

HOW IT WORKS

1 GET STARTED

1 - 2 hours

Students watch intro webinar (25 mins) and then look at school or student data to decide their focus issue

2 VIRTUAL WORKSHOP - UNPACK

1 hour

VicSRC take students through:

- What makes a successful PD session
- Unpacking their issue
- Creating questions to shape their PD session

3 GET READY

1 - 2 hours

Students spend time researching their issue and planning their PD session

4 VIRTUAL WORKSHOP - PREP

1 hour

VicSRC help students finalise their PD session plan, practicing facilitation and engagement techniques

5 GET IT DONE

1 - 2 hours

Students run their PD session for school staff

6 VIRTUAL WORKSHOP - REFLECT

1 hour

VicSRC supports students to reflect on their PD session, work out their next steps and start a plan of action

7 GET TO CHANGING

1 - 2 hours

Students finalise and enact their action plan



Resources are provided to report back to the school community and help support handing over plans to a new group of students at the end of the year to continue the work

THE DETAILS

All 3 virtual workshops are delivered by the VicSRC Programs and Events Coordinator via video conference to students and support staff. These workshops are a combination of interactive presentations and group discussion.

VicSRC will work with you to use the video conferencing platform that your school is currently using, or that your students are most familiar with.

Students are expected to complete tasks between the workshops with the support of their teacher.

The VicSRC Programs and Events Coordinator will liaise with you to get the program started and is available between workshops to answer any questions or help if you get stuck.

All resources required for the program (presentations and worksheets) are provided by VicSRC.

The maximum number of students per workshop is 30.
